Mr. STUMP introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to provide for four-year terms for Members of the House of Representatives and to provide that Members may not serve more than three terms.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-*
3 *thirds of each House concurring therein), That the follow-*
4 *ing article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitu-*
5 *tion of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents*
6 *and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by*

1 the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States
2 within seven years from the date of its submission by the
3 Congress:

4 “ARTICLE —

5 “SECTION 1. The term of office of a Member of the
6 House of Representatives shall be four years, beginning
7 with the first election of Representatives occurring after
8 the ratification of this article.

9 “SECTION 2. No person who has been elected to three
10 four-year terms in the House of Representatives shall be
11 eligible for election to the House of Representatives.”.
