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## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to increase the voting consumer representation of the Blood Products Advisory Committee of the Food and Drug Administration, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Blood Products Advi-  
5       sory Committee Act of 1995”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONSUMER REPRESENTATION ON THE BLOOD**  
2 **PRODUCTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE.**

3 The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall  
4 ensure that not less than  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the voting members of the  
5 Blood Products Advisory Committee shall be—

6 (1) individuals who have received blood prod-  
7 ucts but not in connection with a professional or  
8 commercial activity; and

9 (2) representatives of consumer organizations  
10 with expertise in blood products.

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
