Mr. SOLOMON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight

## A BILL

To prohibit federally sponsored research pertaining to the legalization of drugs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Anti-Drug Legalization  
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 The Congress finds that—

1           (1) the sale, possession and use of drugs pose  
2 a pervasive and substantial threat to the social, edu-  
3 cational, and economic health of the United States;

4           (2) the impact of drug abuse is reflected in the  
5 violence that it causes and in the disintegration of  
6 families, schools, and neighborhoods;

7           (3) the effects of rampant drug use is amply il-  
8 lustrated by national violent crime statistics across  
9 the United States;

10          (4) the overwhelming majority of health care  
11 and law enforcement experts agree that drug legal-  
12 ization would have disastrous consequences for the  
13 people of the United States; and

14          (5) recent studies demonstrate that drug use by  
15 young people is on the rise in the United States.

16 **SEC. 3. RESTRICTION.**

17          Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no de-  
18 partment or agency of the United States Government shall  
19 conduct or finance, in whole or in part, any study or re-  
20 search involving the legalization of drugs.
