A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to enter into an appropriate form of agreement with the town of Grand Lake, Colorado, authorizing the town to maintain permanently a cemetery in the Rocky Mountain National Park.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MAINTENANCE OF CEMETERY IN ROCKY MOUN-**
4 **TAIN NATIONAL PARK.**

5 (a) AGREEMENT.—Notwithstanding any other law,
6 not later than 6 months after the date of enactment of
7 this Act, the Secretary of the Interior shall enter into an

1 appropriate form of agreement with the town of Grand
2 Lake, Colorado, authorizing the town to maintain perma-
3 nently, under appropriate terms and conditions, a ceme-
4 tery within the boundaries of the Rocky Mountain Na-
5 tional Park.

6 (b) CEMETERY BOUNDARIES.—The cemetery shall be
7 comprised of approximately 5 acres of land, as generally
8 depicted on the map entitled “Grand Lake Cemetery” and
9 dated February 1995.

10 (c) AVAILABILITY FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION.—The
11 Secretary of the Interior shall place the map described in
12 subsection (b) on file, and make the map available for pub-
13 lic inspection, in the headquarters office of the Rocky
14 Mountain National Park.

15 (d) LIMITATION.—The cemetery shall not be ex-
16 tended beyond the boundaries of the cemetery shown on
17 the map described in subsection (b).

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
