Mr. TRAFICANT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on International Relations

A BILL

To prohibit United States foreign assistance for Russia unless the Government of Russia prohibits the export of nuclear weapons equipment and related technology and offensive military weapons, equipment, and related technology to terrorist states.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON ASSISTANCE FOR RUSSIA.**

4 (a) PROHIBITION.—The President may not provide
5 foreign assistance for Russia for any fiscal year unless the
6 President certifies to the Congress for such fiscal year that
7 the Government of Russia is not exporting nuclear weap-

1 ons equipment and related technology and offensive mili-
2 tary weapons, equipment, and related technology to a ter-
3 rorist state.

4 (b) REQUIREMENT FOR CONTINUING COMPLI-
5 ANCE.—Any certification with respect to the Government
6 of Russia for a fiscal year under subsection (a) shall cease
7 to be effective for that fiscal year if the President certifies
8 to the Congress that such Government has not continued
9 to comply with the requirements contained in such sub-
10 section.

11 (c) WAIVER.—The prohibition on foreign assistance
12 for Russia under subsection (a) shall not apply if the
13 President determines and notifies the Congress that pro-
14 viding such assistance for Russia is in the national secu-
15 rity interest of the United States.

16 (d) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section:

17 (1) FOREIGN ASSISTANCE.—The term “foreign
18 assistance” means assistance under the Foreign As-
19 sistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2151 et seq.), as-
20 sistance under the Freedom for Russia and Emerg-
21 ing Eurasian Democracies and Open Markets Sup-
22 port Act of 1992 (22 U.S.C. 5801 et seq.), and as-
23 sistance or sales under the Arms Export Control Act
24 (22 U.S.C. 2751 et seq.), except that such term does
25 not include—

1 (A) humanitarian assistance; or

2 (B) assistance for the purpose of disman-
3 tling and destroying nuclear weapons, chemical
4 weapons, and other weapons, and related assist-
5 ance.

6 (2) **TERRORIST STATE.**—The term “terrorist
7 state” means a country, the government of which
8 the Secretary of State has determined, for purposes
9 of section 6(j)(1) of the Export Administration Act
10 of 1979 (50 U.S.C. app. 2405(6)(j)(1)), has repeat-
11 edly provided support for acts of international
12 terrorism.

13 (e) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The prohibition on foreign
14 assistance under subsection (a) shall apply with respect
15 to fiscal years beginning after fiscal year 1995.
