Mr. COOLEY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To provide for the continuation of certain commercial activities at the Red's Horse Ranch area of the Eagle Cap Wilderness, Wallowa and Whitman National Forests, Oregon.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CONTINUATION OF CERTAIN OUTFITTER AC-**
4 **TIVITIES AT RED'S HORSE RANCH, EAGLE**
5 **CAP WILDERNESS, OREGON.**

6 (a) AIRSTRIP ACCESS.—The landing of aircraft at
7 the area known as Red's Horse Ranch, where this use was
8 established before the addition of such area to the Eagle

1 Cap Wilderness, may be permitted to continue subject to
2 such restrictions as the Secretary of Agriculture deems de-
3 sirable.

4 (b) COMMERCIAL SERVICES.—Commercial services
5 may be performed at Red’s Horse Ranch, Oregon, to the
6 extent necessary for activities which are proper for realiz-
7 ing the recreational or other wilderness purposes of the
8 Eagle Cap Wilderness as provided in section 4(d)(5) of
9 the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1133(d)(5)), including a
10 guest ranch, outfitting, hotel, meals, horse rental, pack
11 trips, and tours.

12 (c) RED’S HORSE RANCH AREA DESCRIBED.—For
13 the purposes of this section, the area known as Red’s
14 Horse Ranch is that area added in 1994 to the Eagle Cap
15 Wilderness (as designated by Public Laws 88–577, 92–
16 521, and 98–328), Wallowa and Whitman National For-
17 ests, Oregon, which is located approximately 20 miles west
18 of Enterprise, Oregon, on the Minam River and is more
19 particularly described as follows:

20 The SENE and the NESE, Section 36, Township 2
21 South, Range 41 East, W.M.
