A BILL

To amend the Tariff Act of 1930 to provide that the requirement of marking of imported articles and containers not apply to spice products.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MARKING OF SPICES.**

4 Section 304 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C.
5 1304) is amended—

6 (1) by redesignating subsections (f), (g), (h),
7 and (i) as subsections (g), (h), (i), and (j), respec-
8 tively; and

9 (2) by inserting after subsection (e) the follow-
10 ing new subsection:

1 “(f) MARKING OF SPICES.—The marking require-
2 ments of subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to articles
3 provided for under subheadings 0904.11, 0904.12,
4 0904.20, 0905.00, 0906.10, 0906.20, 0907.00, 0908.10,
5 0908.20, 0908.30, 0909.10, 0909.20, 0909.30, 0909.40,
6 0909.50, 0910.10, 0910.20, 0910.30, 0910.40, 0910.50,
7 0910.91, 0910.99, 1106.20, 1207.40, 1207.50, 1207.91,
8 1404.90, and 3302.10, and items classifiable in categories
9 0712.90.60, 0712.90.8080, 1209.91.2000, 1211.90.2000,
10 1211.90.8040, 1211.90.8050, 1211.90.8090,
11 2006.00.3000, 2918.13.2000, 3203.00.8000,
12 3301.90.1010, 3301.90.1020, and 3301.90.1050 of the
13 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States, as in
14 effect on January 1, 1995.”.

15 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

16 The amendments made by section 1 apply to goods
17 entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption,
18 on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
