Mr. SMITH of Michigan introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Budget

A BILL

To extend the discretionary spending limits set forth in title VI of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 and to extend the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 until fiscal year 2002.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This title may be cited as the “Discretionary Spend-
5 ing Reduction and Control Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. DISCRETIONARY SPENDING LIMITS.**

7 (a) LIMITS.—Section 601(a)(2) of the Congressional
8 Budget Act of 1974 is amended by striking subparagraphs

1 (A), (B), (C), (D), and (F), by redesignating subpara-
2 graph (E) as subparagraph (A) and by striking “and” at
3 the end of that subparagraph, and by inserting after sub-
4 paragraph (A) the following new subparagraphs:

5 “(B) with respect to fiscal year 1996—

6 “(i) for the defense category
7 \$265,406,000,000 in new budget authority
8 and \$264,043,000,000 in outlays; and

9 “(ii) for the nondefense category
10 \$219,668,000,000 in new budget authority
11 and \$267,725,000,000 in outlays;

12 “(C) with respect to fiscal year 1997—

13 “(i) for the defense category
14 \$267,962,000,000 in new budget authority
15 and \$265,734,000,000 in outlays; and

16 “(ii) for the nondefense category
17 \$214,468,000,000 in new budget authority
18 and \$254,561,000,000 in outlays;

19 “(D) with respect to fiscal year 1998—

20 “(i) for the defense category
21 \$269,731,000,000 in new budget authority
22 and \$264,531,000,000 in outlays; and

23 “(ii) for the nondefense category
24 \$220,961,000,000 in new budget authority
25 and \$248,101,000,000 in outlays;

1 “(E) with respect to fiscal year 1999, for
2 the discretionary category \$482,207,000,000 in
3 new budget authority and \$510,482,000,000 in
4 outlays;

5 “(F) with respect to fiscal year 2000, for
6 the discretionary category \$489,379,000,000 in
7 new budget authority and \$514,234,000,000 in
8 outlays;

9 “(G) with respect to fiscal year 2001, for
10 the discretionary category \$496,601,000,000 in
11 new budget authority and \$516,403,000,000 in
12 outlays; and

13 “(H) with respect to fiscal year 2002, for
14 the discretionary category \$498,837,000,000 in
15 new budget authority and \$515,075,000,000 in
16 outlays;”.

17 (b) COMMITTEE ALLOCATIONS AND ENFORCE-
18 MENT.—Section 602 of the Congressional Budget Act of
19 1974 is amended—

20 (1) in subsection (c), by striking “1995” and
21 inserting “2002” and by striking its last sentence;
22 and

23 (2) in subsection (d), by striking “1992 TO
24 1995” in the side heading and inserting “1995 TO

1 2002” and by striking “1992 through 1995” and in-
2 sserting “1995 through 2002”.

3 (c) FIVE-YEAR BUDGET RESOLUTIONS.—Section
4 606 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 is amend-
5 ed—

6 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “1992, 1993,
7 1994, or 1995” and inserting “1995, 1996, 1997,
8 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, or 2002”; and

9 (2) in subsection (d)(1), by striking “1992,
10 1993, 1994, and 1995” and inserting “1995, 1996,
11 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002”, and by
12 striking “(i) and (ii)”.

13 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Section 607 of the Congres-
14 sional Budget Act of 1974 is amended by striking “1991
15 to 1998” and inserting “1995 to 2002”.

16 (e) SEQUESTRATION REGARDING CRIME TRUST
17 FUND.—(1) Section 251A(b)(1) of the Balanced Budget
18 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 is amended
19 by striking subparagraphs (B), (C), and (D) and its last
20 two sentences and inserting the following:

21 “(B) For fiscal year 1996,
22 \$1,827,000,000.

23 “(C) For fiscal year 1997, \$3,082,000,000.

24 “(D) For fiscal year 1998,
25 \$3,840,000,000.

1 “(E) For fiscal year 1999,
2 \$4,415,000,000.

3 “(F) For fiscal year 2000,
4 \$4,874,000,000.

5 “The appropriate levels of new budget authority are
6 as follows: for fiscal year 1996, \$3,357,000,000; for
7 fiscal year 1997, \$3,915,000,000; for fiscal year
8 1998, \$4,306,000,000; for fiscal year 1999,
9 \$5,089,000,000; and for fiscal year 2000,
10 \$5,089,000,000.”.

11 (2) The last two sentences of section 310002 of the
12 Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994
13 (42 U.S.C. 14212) are repealed.

14 **SEC. 3. GENERAL STATEMENT AND DEFINITIONS.**

15 (a) GENERAL STATEMENT.—Section 250(b) of the
16 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
17 1985 is amended by striking the first sentence and insert-
18 ing the following: “This part provides for the enforcement
19 of deficit reduction through discretionary spending limits
20 and pay-as-you-go requirements for fiscal years 1995
21 through 2002.”.

22 (b) DEFINITIONS.—Section 250(c) of the Balanced
23 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 is
24 amended—

1 (1) by striking paragraph (4) and inserting the
2 following:

3 “(4) The term ‘category’ means all discre-
4 tionary appropriations.”;

5 (2) by striking paragraph (6) and inserting the
6 following:

7 “(6) The term ‘budgetary resources’ means new
8 budget authority, unobligated balances, direct spend-
9 ing authority, and obligation limitations.”;

10 (3) in paragraph (9), by striking “1992” and
11 inserting “1995”;

12 (4) in paragraph (14), by striking “1995” and
13 inserting “2002”; and

14 (5) by striking paragraph (17) and by redesign-
15 ating paragraphs (18) through (21) as paragraphs
16 (17) through (20), respectively.

17 **SEC. 4. ENFORCING DISCRETIONARY SPENDING LIMITS.**

18 Section 251 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
19 Deficit Control Act of 1985 is amended—

20 (1) in the side heading of subsection (a), by
21 striking “1991–1998” and inserting “1995–2002”;

22 (2) in the first sentence of subsection (b)(1), by
23 striking “1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997 or
24 1998” and inserting “1995, 1996, 1997, 1998,

1 1999, 2000, 2001, or 2002” and by striking
2 “through 1998” and inserting “through 2002”;

3 (3) in subsection (b)(1), by striking subpara-
4 graphs (B) and (C) and by striking “the following:”
5 and all that follows through “The adjustments” and
6 inserting “the following: the adjustments”;

7 (4) in subsection (b)(2), by striking “1991,
8 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, or 1998” and
9 inserting “1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000,
10 2001, or 2002” and by striking “through 1998” and
11 inserting “through 2002”;

12 (5) by striking subparagraphs (A), (B), and (C)
13 of subsection (b)(2);

14 (6) in subsection (b)(2)(E), by striking clauses
15 (i), (ii), and (iii) and by striking “(iv) if, for fiscal
16 years 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998” and in-
17 sserting “If, for fiscal years 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998,
18 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002”; and

19 (7) in subsection (b)(2)(F), strike everything
20 after “the adjustment in outlays” and insert “for a
21 category for a fiscal year shall not exceed 0.5 per-
22 cent of the adjusted discretionary spending limit on
23 outlays for that fiscal year in fiscal year 1996, 1997,
24 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, or 2002.”.

1 **SEC. 5. ENFORCING PAY-AS-YOU-GO.**

2 Section 252 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
3 Deficit Control Act of 1985 is amended—

4 (1) in the side heading of subsection (a), by
5 striking “1992–1998” and inserting “1995–2002”;

6 (2) in subsection (d), by striking “1998” each
7 place it appears and inserting “2002”; and

8 (3) in subsection (e), by striking “1991 through
9 1998” and inserting “1995 through 2002” and by
10 striking “through 1995” and inserting “through
11 2002”.

12 **SEC. 6. REPORTS AND ORDERS.**

13 Section 254 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
14 Deficit Control Act of 1985 is amended—

15 (1) in subsection (d)(2), by striking “1998”
16 and inserting “2002”; and

17 (2) in subsection (g), by striking “1998” each
18 place it appears and inserting “2002”.

19 **SEC. 7. TECHNICAL CORRECTION.**

20 Section 258 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
21 Deficit Control Act of 1985, entitled “Modification of
22 Presidential Order”, is repealed.

23 **SEC. 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

24 (a) EXPIRATION.—Section 275(b) of the Balanced
25 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 is
26 amended by striking “1995” and inserting “2002”.

1 (b) EXPIRATION.—Section 14002(c)(3) of the Omni-
2 bus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 (2 U.S.C. 900
3 note; 2 U.S.C. 665 note) is repealed.
