1 **SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF MATERIALS REUSED IN AN IN-**
2 **DUSTRIAL PROCESS FROM THE SOLID WASTE**
3 **DESIGNATION UNDER THE SOLID WASTE DIS-**
4 **POSAL ACT.**

5 Section 1004(27) of the Solid Waste Disposal Act (42
6 U.S.C. 6903(27)) is amended by inserting after “domestic
7 sewage,” the following: “or solid or dissolved materials
8 contained, collected, and reused in an on-site production
9 process that prevents releases to the environment,”.
