A BILL

To amend section 326 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 to permit continued participation by Historically Black Graduate Professional Schools in the grant program authorized by that section.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

4 The Congress finds the following:

5 (1) The Historically Black Graduate Profes-
6 sional Schools identified under section 326 of the
7 Higher Education Act may receive grant funds if the
8 Secretary of Education determines that such institu-

1 tions make a substantial contribution to the legal,
2 medical, dental, veterinary, or other graduate oppor-
3 tunity for African Americans.

4 (2) The health professions schools which par-
5 ticipate under section 326 train 50 percent of the
6 Nation's African American physicians, 50 percent of
7 the Nation's African American dentists, 50 percent
8 of the Nation's African American pharmacists, and
9 75 percent of the Nation's African American veteri-
10 narians.

11 (3) A majority of the graduates of these schools
12 practice in poor urban and rural areas of the coun-
13 try providing care to many disadvantaged Ameri-
14 cans.

15 (4) The survival of these schools will contribute
16 to the improved health status of disadvantaged per-
17 sons, and of all Americans.

18 **SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF GRANT RENEWAL LIMITATION.**

19 Section 326(b) of the Higher Education Act of 1965
20 (20 U.S.C. 1063b(b)) is amended by striking the second
21 sentence.

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
