Mr. KIM introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Commerce and, in addition, to the Committees on Ways and Means, Banking and Financial Services, Economic and Educational Opportunities, Agriculture, and the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit public welfare assistance to aliens not lawfully in the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. INELIGIBILITY OF ALIENS NOT LAWFULLY IN**
4 **THE UNITED STATES FOR PUBLIC WELFARE**
5 **ASSISTANCE.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
7 sion of law and except as provided in subsection (b), any

1 alien who is not lawfully in the United States shall be in-
2 eligible for any program referred to in subsection (c).

3 (b) PROGRAM FOR WHICH ALIENS NOT LAWFULLY
4 IN THE UNITED STATES MAY BE ELIGIBLE.—The limita-
5 tion under subsection (a) shall not apply to medical assist-
6 ance with respect to emergency services (as defined for
7 purposes of section 1916(a)(2)(D) of the Social Security
8 Act).

9 (c) PROGRAMS FOR WHICH ALIENS NOT LAWFULLY
10 IN THE UNITED STATES ARE INELIGIBLE.—The pro-
11 grams referred to in this subsection are the following:

12 (1) The program of medical assistance under
13 title XIX of the Social Security Act, except emer-
14 gency services as provided in subsection (c).

15 (2) The Maternal and Child Health Services
16 Block Grant Program under title V of the Social Se-
17 curity Act.

18 (3) The program established in section 330 of
19 the Public Health Service Act (relating to commu-
20 nity health centers).

21 (4) The program established in section 1001 of
22 the Public Health Service Act (relating to family
23 planning methods and services).

1 (5) The program established in section 329 of
2 the Public Health Service Act (relating to migrant
3 health centers).

4 (6) The program of aid and services to needy
5 families with children under part A of title IV of the
6 Social Security Act.

7 (7) The child welfare services program under
8 part B of title IV of the Social Security Act.

9 (8) The supplemental security income program
10 under title XVI of the Social Security Act.

11 (9) The program of foster care and adoption
12 assistance under part E of title IV of the Social
13 Security Act.

14 (10) The school lunch program carried out
15 under the National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C.
16 1751 et seq.).

17 (11) The special supplemental food program for
18 women, infants, and children carried out under sec-
19 tion 17 of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42
20 U.S.C. 1786).

21 (12) The nutrition programs carried out under
22 part C of title III of the Older Americans Act of
23 1965 (42 U.S.C. 3030e et seq.).

1 (13) The school breakfast program carried out
2 under section 4 of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966

5 carried out under section 17 of the National School
6 Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1766).

15 (25) The program of assistance payments on
16 behalf of homeowners under section 235 of the Na-
17 tional Housing Act (12 U.S.C. 1715z).

18 (26) The program of rent supplement payments
19 on behalf of qualified tenants pursuant to contracts
20 entered into under section 101 of the Housing and
21 Urban Development Act of 1965 (12 U.S.C. 1701s).

22 (27) The loan and grant programs under sec-
23 tion 504 of the Housing Act of 1949 (42 U.S.C.
24 1474) for repairs and improvements to rural dwell-
25 ings.

1 (28) The loan and assistance programs under
2 sections 514 and 516 of the Housing Act of 1949
3 (42 U.S.C. 1484, 1486) for housing for farm labor.

4 (29) The program of grants for preservation
5 and rehabilitation of housing under section 533 of
6 the Housing Act of 1949 (42 U.S.C. 1490m).

7 (30) The program of grants and loans for mu-
8 tual and self-help housing and technical assistance
9 under section 523 of the Housing Act of 1949 (42
10 U.S.C. 1490c).

11 (31) The program of site loans under section
12 524 of the Housing Act of 1949 (42 U.S.C. 1490d).

13 (32) The program under part B of title IV of
14 the Higher Education Act of 1965.

15 (33) The program under subpart 1 of part A of
16 title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965.

17 (34) The program under part C of title IV of
18 the Higher Education Act of 1965.

19 (35) The program under subpart 3 of part A of
20 title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965.

21 (36) The program under part E of title IV of

8 Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986.

9 (d) NOTIFICATION OF PROGRAM BENEFICIARIES.—
10 Any Federal agency that administers a program referred
11 to in subsection (c) shall, directly or through the States,
12 notify each recipient of benefits of the changes in eligi-
13 bility under this Act.

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
