

1 “(38) The Great Western Scenic Trail, a system of
2 trails to accommodate a variety of travel users in a cor-
3 ridor of approximately 3,100 miles in length extending
4 from the Arizona-Mexico border to the Idaho-Montana-
5 Canada border, following the approximate route depicted
6 on the map identified as ‘Great Western Trail Corridor,
7 1988’, which shall be on file and available for public in-
8 spection in the Office of the Chief of the Forest Service,
9 United States Department of Agriculture. The trail study
10 shall be conducted by the Secretary of Agriculture, in con-
11 sultation with the Secretary of the Interior, in accordance
12 with subsection (b) and shall include—

13 “(A) the current status of land ownership and
14 current and potential use along the designated route;

15 “(B) the estimated cost of acquisition of lands
16 or interests in lands, if any; and

17 “(C) an examination of the appropriateness of
18 motorized trail use along the trail.”.
