1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as “The Fall River Visitor
3 Center Act of 1995”.

4 **SEC. 2. EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS OUTSIDE AUTHORIZED**
5 **BOUNDARY OF ROCKY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL**
6 **PARK.**

7 (a) VISITOR CENTER.—The Secretary of the Interior
8 is authorized to collect and expend donated funds and ex-
9 pend appropriated funds for the operation and mainte-
10 nance of a visitor center to be constructed for visitors to
11 and administration of Rocky Mountain National Park
12 with private funds on the privately owned lands described
13 in subsection (b).

14 (b) DESCRIPTION OF PARCELS OF LAND.—The lands
15 referred to in subsection (a) are described as follows:

16 Being land owned by H.W. Stewart, Inc., and
17 more particularly described as follows:

18 Beginning at the southwest corner of the
19 north one-half of section 16, township 5 north,
20 range 73 west of the sixth principal meridian,
21 Colorado; thence south eighty-seven degrees six
22 minutes east, eight hundred and fifty-four feet;
23 thence north two degrees west, three hundred
24 and forty-six and one-tenth feet to the south
25 boundary of the right-of-way of U.S. Highway
26 34; thence northwesterly along said south

1 boundary nine hundred and sixty feet to the
2 west line of said section 16; thence south along
3 the west line of said section 16 to the point of
4 beginning.
