Mr. LINDER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the  
Committee on Judiciary

## A BILL

For the relief of Larry Errol Pieterse.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. WAIVER OF GROUNDS FOR DEPORTATION OR**  
4 **EXCLUSION OF LARRY ERROL PIETERSE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding sections  
6 212(a)(2)(A), 241(a)(1)(A), and 241(a)(2)(B) of the Im-  
7 migration and Nationality Act, Larry Errol Pieterse may  
8 not be deported from the United States or excluded from  
9 admission into the United States by reason of any offense  
10 for which he received a full pardon from the Governor of  
11 Florida prior to January 1, 1992.

1           (b) RESCISSION OF OUTSTANDING DEPORTATION  
2 ORDER.—The Attorney General shall rescind any out-  
3 standing order of deportation or finding of deportability  
4 that has been entered against Larry Errol Pieterse by rea-  
5 son of any offense for which he received a full pardon from  
6 the Governor of Florida prior to January 1, 1992.

7           (c) PERMANENT RESIDENCE STATUS.—Notwith-  
8 standing any order terminating the status of Larry Errol  
9 Pieterse as an alien lawfully admitted for permanent resi-  
10 dence, for purposes of the Immigration and Nationality  
11 Act he shall be considered lawfully admitted for perma-  
12 nent residence as of November 3, 1981, and such status  
13 shall be considered not to have changed between such date  
14 and the date of the enactment of this Act.

15           (d) ESTABLISHMENT OF GOOD MORAL CHAR-  
16 ACTER.—Notwithstanding section 101(f) of the Immigra-  
17 tion and Nationality Act, any offense for which Larry  
18 Errol Pieterse received a full pardon from the Governor  
19 of Florida prior to January 1, 1992, may not be consid-  
20 ered in determining whether he is, or during any period  
21 has been, a person of good moral character for purposes  
22 of such Act.
