Mr. BARTON of Texas introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To prohibit aircraft from flying over the Ballpark in Arlington, Texas, during certain times, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION.**

4 Except in the case of an in-flight emergency and
5 flights for purposes of providing law enforcement or medi-
6 cal assistance, aircraft are prohibited from flying at less
7 than 2,000 feet above mean sea level over, and within
8 2,000 feet horizontal distance of, the Ballpark in Arling-
9 ton, located in Arlington, Texas, during any public event
10 at the Ballpark that is identified by the city of Arlington

1 to the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administra-
2 tion. The identification shall be in such form and contain
3 such information as the Administrator may require. The
4 prohibition shall begin 2 hours before the event and end
5 1 hour after the conclusion of the event. The Adminis-
6 trator shall take appropriate action to provide for the de-
7 piction and publication of such prohibition at the Ballpark
8 in Arlington and airports providing service to the sur-
9 rounding area.

10 **SEC. 2. VIOLATIONS.**

11 A violation of section 1 shall be treated as a violation
12 of section 40103(b) of title 49, United States Code, is
13 treated for purposes of a civil penalty or certificate en-
14 forcement action by the Administrator of the Federal
15 Aviation Administration.

16 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

17 Sections 1 and 2 shall take effect 120 days after the
18 date of the enactment of this Act.
