Mr. ARMEY (for himself and Mr. GEPHARDT) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

Providing for the transfer of certain employee positions.

1 *Resolved*, That (a)(1) the two statutory positions
2 specified in paragraph (2) are transferred from the House
3 Republican Conference to the majority leader.

4 (2) The positions referred to in paragraph (1) are—

5 (A) the position established by section
6 102(a)(2) of the Legislative Branch Appropriations
7 Act, 1988, as contained in section 101(i) of Public
8 Law 100–202; and

9 (B) the position established by section
10 102(a)(2) of the Legislative Branch Appropriations
11 Act, 1990.

1 (b)(1) The two statutory positions specified in para-
2 graph (2) are transferred from the majority leader to the
3 House Republican Conference.

4 (2) The positions referred to in paragraph (1) are—

5 (A) the position established for the chief deputy
6 majority whip by subsection (a) of the first section
7 of House Resolution 393, Ninety-fifth Congress,
8 agreed to March 31, 1977, as enacted into perma-
9 nent law by section 115 of the Legislative Branch
10 Appropriation Act, 1978 (2 U.S.C. 74a-3); and

11 (B) the position established for the chief deputy
12 majority whip by section 102(a)(4) of the Legislative
13 Branch Appropriations Act, 1990;

14 both of which positions were transferred to the majority
15 leader by House Resolution 10, One Hundred Fourth Con-
16 gress, agreed to January 5 (legislative day, January 4),
17 1995.

18 SEC. 2. (a)(1) The two statutory positions specified
19 in paragraph (2) are transferred from the Democratic
20 Steering and Policy Committee to the minority leader.

21 (2) The positions referred to in paragraph (1) are—

22 (A) one of the two positions established by sec-
23 tion 103(a)(1) of the Legislative Branch Appropria-
24 tions Act, 1986; and

1 (B) the position established by section
2 102(a)(1) of the Legislative Branch Appropriations
3 Act, 1988, as contained in section 101(i) of Public
4 Law 100–202.

5 (b)(1) The two statutory positions specified in para-
6 graph (2) are transferred from the minority leader to the
7 Democratic Steering and Policy Committee.

8 (2) The positions referred to in paragraph (1) are—

9 (A) the position established by section
10 102(a)(3) of the Legislative Branch Appropriations
11 Act, 1990; and

12 (B) the position established by paragraph 2. (a)
13 of House Resolution 690, Eighty-ninth Congress,
14 agreed to January 26, 1966, as enacted into perma-
15 nent law by section 103 of the Legislative Branch
16 Appropriation Act, 1967.

17 SEC. 3. (a) Upon the enactment of this section into
18 permanent law, the amendment made by subsection (b)
19 shall take effect.

20 (b) Subsection (a) of the first section of House Reso-
21 lution 393, Ninety-fifth Congress, agreed to March 31,
22 1977, as enacted into permanent law by section 115 of
23 the Legislative Branch Appropriation Act, 1978 (2 U.S.C.

- 1 74a-3) is amended by striking out “chief majority whip”
- 2 and inserting in lieu thereof “chief deputy majority whip”.
