Mr. BRYANT of Texas submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

---

# RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the resolution (H. Res. 40) to amend the Rules of the House of Representatives concerning the receipt of gifts from lobbyists and other persons, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this  
2 resolution the House shall resolve itself into the Commit-  
3 tee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the  
4 consideration of the resolution (H. Res. 40) to amend the  
5 Rules of the House of Representatives concerning the re-  
6 ceipt of gifts from lobbyists and other persons, and for  
7 other purposes. The first reading of the resolution shall  
8 be dispensed with, and all points of order against the reso-

1 lution and against its consideration are waived. After gen-  
2 eral debate, which shall be confined to the resolution and  
3 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled  
4 by the majority leader and the minority leader, or their  
5 designees, the resolution shall be considered for amend-  
6 ment under the five-minute rule and shall be considered  
7 as read. No amendment shall be in order except—

8           (1) an amendment in the nature of a substitute,  
9           if offered by the majority leader or his designee;  
10          and, after disposition of said amendment; and

11          (2) an amendment in the nature of a substitute,  
12          if offered by the minority leader or his designee.

13 If more than one of the amendments in the nature of a  
14 substitute is adopted, only the last to be adopted shall be  
15 considered as finally adopted and reported to the House.  
16 The amendments are debatable for one hour each, equally  
17 divided and controlled by the proponent and opponent  
18 thereto, are not subject to amendment, and are not subject  
19 to a demand for a division of the question in the House  
20 or in the Committee of the Whole, and are in order even  
21 if amending text previously amended. At the conclusion  
22 of the consideration of the resolution for amendment, the  
23 Committee shall rise and report the resolution to the  
24 House with such amendment as may have been adopted,  
25 and the previous question shall be considered as ordered

- 1 on the resolution and any amendment thereto to final pas-
- 2 sage without intervening motion except one motion to re-
- 3 commit, with or without instructions.
