Amending clause 4 of rule XIII of the Rules of the House to abolish the Consent Calendar and to establish in its place a Corrections Calendar.

Mrs. VUCANOVICH (for herself, Mr. ZELIFF, Mr. MCINTOSH, and Mr. SOLOMON) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Amending clause 4 of rule XIII of the Rules of the House to abolish the Consent Calendar and to establish in its place a Corrections Calendar.

1 *Resolved*, That clause 4 of rule XIII of the Rules of
2 the House of Representatives is amended to read as fol-
3 lows:

4 “4. (a) After a bill has been favorably reported and
5 placed on either the Union or House Calendar, the Speak-
6 er may file with the Clerk a notice requesting that such
7 bill also be placed upon a special calendar to be known
8 as the “Corrections Calendar”. On the second and fourth
9 Tuesdays of each month, immediately after the reading

1 of the Journal, the Speaker may direct the Clerk to call
2 the bills in numerical order which have been on the Correc-
3 tions Calendar for three legislative days.

4 “(b) Bills so called shall be considered in the House,
5 debatable for one hour equally divided and controlled by
6 the chairman and ranking minority member of the pri-
7 mary committee of jurisdiction reporting the bill, shall not
8 be subject to amendment except those amendments rec-
9 ommended by the primary committee of jurisdiction or
10 those offered by the chairman of the primary committee,
11 and the previous question shall be considered as ordered
12 on the bill and any amendment thereto to final passage
13 without intervening motion.

14 “(c) A three-fifths vote of the members voting shall
15 be required to pass any bill called from the Corrections
16 Calendar but the rejection of any such bill, or the sustain-
17 ing of any point of order against it or its consideration,
18 shall not cause it to be removed from the Calendar to
19 which it was originally referred.”.
