JULY 19, 1995

Mr. SOLOMON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

---

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of a bill establishing United States policy toward China and a joint resolution relating to most-favored-nation treatment for the People's Republic of China.

1       *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution  
2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.  
3 2058) establishing United States policy toward China. The  
4 bill shall be debatable for ninety minutes equally divided  
5 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority  
6 member of the Committee on International Relations. The

1 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the  
2 bill to final passage without intervening motion except one  
3 motion to recommit. The motion to recommit may include  
4 instructions only if offered by the minority leader or his  
5 designee.

6       SEC. 2. After disposition of H.R. 2058, it shall be  
7 in order to consider in the House the joint resolution (H.  
8 J. Res. 96) disapproving the extension of nondiscrim-  
9 inatory treatment (most-favored-nation treatment) to the  
10 products of the People's Republic of China. The joint reso-  
11 lution shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and  
12 controlled by Representative Wolf of Virginia and Rep-  
13 resentative Archer of Texas or their designees. Pursuant  
14 to sections 152 and 153 of the Trade Act of 1974, the  
15 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the  
16 joint resolution to final passage without intervening mo-  
17 tion except one motion to table, if offered by Representa-  
18 tive Wolf or his designee. The provisions of sections 152  
19 and 153 of the Trade Act of 1974 shall not apply to any  
20 other joint resolution disapproving the extension of most-  
21 favored-nation treatment to the People's Republic of  
22 China for the remainder of the first session of the One  
23 Hundred Fourth Congress.
