Mr. QUILLEN, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2099) making appropriations for the Departments of Veterans Affairs and Housing and Urban Development, and for sundry independent agencies, boards, commissions, corporations, and offices for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, and for other purposes.

- 1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
- 3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 2099) making appropriations for  
3 the Departments of Veterans Affairs and Housing and  
4 Urban Development, and for sundry independent agencies,  
5 boards, commissions, corporations, and offices for the fis-  
6 cal year ending September 30, 1996, and for other pur-  
7 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.  
8 General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not  
9 exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the  
10 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee  
11 on Appropriations. After general debate the bill shall be  
12 considered for amendment under the five-minute rule, and  
13 the amendment printed in part 1 of the report of the Com-  
14 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution shall be con-  
15 sidered as pending. That amendment shall be considered  
16 as read, shall be debatable for thirty minutes equally di-  
17 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-  
18 ity member of the Committee on Appropriations, shall not  
19 be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a  
20 demand for division of the question in the House or in  
21 the Committee of the Whole. If that amendment is adopt-  
22 ed, the provisions of the bill, as amended, shall be consid-  
23 ered as the original bill for the purpose of further amend-  
24 ment under the five-minute rule. Further consideration of  
25 the bill for amendment shall proceed by title rather than

1 by paragraph. Each title shall be considered as read.  
2 Points of order against provisions in the bill for failure  
3 to comply with clause 2 or 6 of rule XXI are waived. All  
4 points of order against amendments printed in part 2 of  
5 the report of the Committee on Rules are waived. During  
6 further consideration of the bill for amendment, the Chair-  
7 man of the Committee of the Whole may accord priority  
8 in recognition on the basis of whether the Member offering  
9 an amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion  
10 of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose  
11 in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall  
12 be considered as read. At the conclusion of consideration  
13 of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and  
14 report the bill to the House with such amendments as may  
15 have been adopted. The previous question shall be consid-  
16 ered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to  
17 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-  
18 tion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
