Ms. PRYCE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 2259) to disapprove certain sentencing guideline amendments.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2259) to disapprove certain sentenc-
6 ing guideline amendments. The first reading of the bill
7 shall be dispensed with. Points of order against consider-
8 ation of the bill for failure to comply with clause 2(l)(2)(B)

1 of rule XI are waived. General debate shall be confined
2 to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided
3 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority
4 member of the Committee on the Judiciary. After general
5 debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under
6 the five-minute rule. An amendment in the nature of a
7 substitute consisting of the text of S. 1254, as passed by
8 the Senate, shall be considered as adopted in the House
9 and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as amended,
10 shall be considered as the original bill for the purpose of
11 further amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill,
12 as amended, shall be considered as read. No further
13 amendment shall be in order except the amendment in the
14 nature of a substitute printed in the report of the Commit-
15 tee on Rules accompanying this resolution, which may be
16 offered only by Representative Conyers of Michigan or his
17 designee, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable
18 for one hour equally divided and controlled by the pro-
19 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to
20 amendment. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill
21 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the
22 bill, as amended, to the House with such further amend-
23 ment as may have been adopted. The previous question
24 shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended,
25 and any amendment thereto to final passage without inter-

1 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or
2 without instructions.

3 SEC. 2. After passage of H.R. 2259, it shall be in
4 order to take from the Speaker's table the bill S. 1254
5 and to consider the Senate bill in the House. All points
6 of order against the Senate bill and against its consider-
7 ation are waived. It shall be in order to move to strike
8 all after the enacting clause of the Senate bill and to insert
9 in lieu thereof the provisions of H.R. 2259 as passed by
10 the House. All points of order against that motion are
11 waived. If the motion is adopted and the Senate bill, as
12 amended, is passed, then it shall be in order to move that
13 the House insist on its amendment to S. 1254 and request
14 a conference with the Senate thereon.
