Relating to the deployment of United States Armed Forces in and around the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina to enforce the peace agreement between the parties to the conflict in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Mr. BUYER (for himself and Mr. SKELTON) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations, and in addition to the Committee on National Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

RESOLUTION

Relating to the deployment of United States Armed Forces in and around the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina to enforce the peace agreement between the parties to the conflict in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

3 The House of Representatives finds the following:

4 (1) On October 30, 1995, the House of Rep-
5 representatives agreed to H. Res. 247, which expressed

1 the sense of the House of Representatives that in
2 the negotiations of any peace agreement regarding
3 the conflict in the Republic of Bosnia and
4 Herzegovina there should not be a presumption that
5 United States Armed Forces would be deployed to
6 that country to enforce such an agreement, and that
7 in any event, no United States Armed Forces should
8 be deployed on the ground in the territory of the Re-
9 public of Bosnia and Herzegovina to enforce such an
10 agreement until the Congress has approved such a
11 deployment.

12 (2) On November 17, 1995, the House of Rep-
13 resentatives passed H.R. 2606, which provided that
14 none of the funds appropriated or otherwise made
15 available to the Department of Defense could be ob-
16 ligated or expended for the deployment on the
17 ground of United States Armed Forces in the Re-
18 public of Bosnia and Herzegovina unless funds for
19 such deployment were specifically appropriated by
20 law.

21 (3) Despite the expressed will of the House of
22 Representatives heretofore mentioned, the President
23 has chosen to proceed with the deployment of ap-
24 proximately 20,000 members of the United States
25 Armed Forces on the ground in the territory of the

1 Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina to enforce the
2 peace agreement among the parties to the conflict in
3 the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina initialed in
4 Dayton, Ohio, on November 21, 1995.

5 **SEC. 2. DECLARATIONS OF POLICY.**

6 The House of Representatives declares that—

7 (1) it is confident that the members of the
8 United States Armed Forces, in whom it has the
9 greatest pride and admiration, will perform their re-
10 sponsibilities with professional excellence, dedicated
11 patriotism, and exemplary courage;

12 (2) the President and the Secretary of Defense
13 should rely on the judgment of the commander of
14 the United States Armed Forces that are deployed
15 in and around the territory of the Republic of
16 Bosnia and Herzegovina in all matters affecting the
17 safety, support, and well-being of such members of
18 the Armed Forces;

19 (3) the President and the Secretary of Defense
20 should ensure that the commander of the United
21 States Armed Forces that are deployed in and
22 around the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and
23 Herzegovina is furnished the resources and support
24 that he needs to ensure the safety, support, and

1 well-being of such members of the Armed Forces;
2 and

3 (4) the United States Government in all re-
4 spects should be impartial and evenhanded with all
5 parties to the conflict in the Republic of Bosnia and
6 Herzegovina as necessary to assure the safety and
7 protection of the United States Armed Forces in and
8 around the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and
9 Herzegovina.

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
