Mr. ZIMMER (for himself, Mr. HOKE, and Mr. TIAHRT) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Commerce

RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that President Clinton should ask for the resignation of Hazel O'Leary as Secretary of Energy and the General Accounting Office should investigate her travel practices as Secretary of Energy.

Whereas Secretary O'Leary has shown a callous disregard for Congress's efforts to stop wasteful government spending;

Whereas Secretary O'Leary's excessive travel practices and hiring of an outside public relations firm to analyze press coverage of the Department of Energy demonstrate a lack of judgment; and

Whereas Secretary O'Leary has spent millions of dollars on junkets to India, China, Pakistan, France, and South Af-

rica using private jets and accompanied by large entourages of government employees: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the Congress that—

2 (1) President Clinton should ask for the res-
3 ignation of Hazel O’Leary as Secretary of Energy;

4 (2) the General Accounting Office should inves-
5 tigate Hazel O’Leary’s travel practices as Secretary
6 of Energy; and

7 (3) Hazel O’Leary should reimburse taxpayers
8 for any expenses found to be made in abuse of her
9 official duties.
