## RESOLUTION

Providing for payment of a lump sum for accrued annual leave to eligible former employees of the House of Representatives.

1       *Resolved,*

2       **SECTION 1. LUMP-SUM PAYMENT FOR ACCRUED ANNUAL**

3                       **LEAVE.**

4           (a) IN GENERAL.—An eligible employee of the House  
5 of Representatives—

6                       (1) who is separated from employment involun-  
7           tarily;

1           (2) whose last day of employment is during the  
2           period beginning on January 3, 1995, and ending on  
3           June 30, 1995; and

4           (3) who is not reemployed by the House of Rep-  
5           resentatives, the Senate, or an agency of the legisla-  
6           tive branch within 30 days after such last day of  
7           employment;

8 shall be paid a lump sum for the accrued annual leave  
9 of the employee.

10       (b) PAYMENT.—The lump sum—

11           (1) shall be paid, as certified under subsection  
12           (c), in an amount equal to the value of the total ac-  
13           crued annual leave of the employee or the value of  
14           30 days of the accrued annual leave of the employee,  
15           whichever is less;

16           (2) shall be paid—

17           (A) for clerk hire employees, from the clerk  
18           hire allowance of the Member for calendar year  
19           1995;

20           (B) for committee employees, from  
21           amounts appropriated for committees; and

22           (C) for other employees, from amounts ap-  
23           propriated to the employing authority for fiscal  
24           year 1995; and

1           (3) shall be computed using the rate of pay in  
2           effect with respect to the employee on the last day  
3           of employment of the employee.

4           (c) CERTIFICATION.—For purposes of this resolution,  
5           accrued annual leave of an employee shall be certified by  
6           the appropriate employing authority—

7           (1) as of December 31, 1994, in the case of an  
8           employee whose last day of employment is January  
9           3, 1995; and

10          (2) as of the last day of employment of the em-  
11          ployee, in the case of an employee whose last day of  
12          employment is after January 3, 1995, and before  
13          July 1, 1995.

14   **SEC. 2. REGULATIONS.**

15          The Committee on House Oversight shall have au-  
16          thority to prescribe regulations to carry out this resolu-  
17          tion.

18   **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.**

19          As used in this resolution—

20          (1) the term “eligible employee” means, with  
21          respect to the House of Representatives, an em-  
22          ployee whose pay is disbursed by the Clerk of the  
23          House of Representatives or the Chief Administra-  
24          tive Officer of the House of Representatives, as ap-  
25          plicable, except that such term does not include—

1           (A) an employee under the clerk hire allow-  
2           ance whose appointing Member is not a Mem-  
3           ber of the House of Representatives in the One  
4           Hundred Fourth Congress; or

5           (B) a uniformed or civilian support em-  
6           ployee under the Capitol Police Board; and

7           (2) the term “agency of the legislative branch”  
8           means the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, the  
9           Botanic Garden, the General Accounting Office, the  
10          Government Printing Office, the Library of Con-  
11          gress, the Office of Technology Assessment, and the  
12          Congressional Budget Office.
