Mr. Goss, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 3103) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to improve portability and continuity of health insurance coverage in the group and individual markets, to combat waste, fraud, and abuse in health insurance and health care delivery, to promote the use of medical savings accounts, to improve access to long-term care services and coverage, to simplify the administration of health insurance, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 3103) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to
4 improve portability and continuity of health insurance cov-
5 erage in the group and individual markets, to combat
6 waste, fraud, and abuse in health insurance and health
7 care delivery, to promote the use of medical savings ac-
8 counts, to improve access to long-term care services and
9 coverage, to simplify the administration of health insur-
10 ance, and for other purposes. An amendment in the nature
11 of a substitute consisting of the text of H.R. 3160, modi-
12 fied by the amendment specified in part 1 of the report
13 of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution,
14 shall be considered as adopted. All points of order against
15 the bill, as amended, and against its consideration are
16 waived (except those arising under section 425(a) of the
17 Congressional Budget Act of 1974). The previous question
18 shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended,
19 and on any further amendment thereto to final passage
20 without intervening motion except: (1) two hours of debate
21 on the bill, as amended, with 45 minutes equally divided
22 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority
23 member of the Committee on Ways and Means, 45 min-
24 utes equally divided and controlled by the chairman and
25 ranking minority member of the Committee on Commerce,

1 and 30 minutes equally divided and controlled by the
2 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
3 on Economic and Educational Opportunities; (2) the fur-
4 ther amendment specified in part 2 of the Committee on
5 Rules, if offered by the minority leader or his designee,
6 which shall be in order without intervention of any point
7 of order (except those arising under section 425(a) of the
8 Congressional Budget Act of 1974) or demand for division
9 of the question, shall be considered as read, and shall be
10 separately debatable for one hour equally divided and con-
11 trolled by the proponent and an opponent; and (3) one
12 motion to recommit, which may include instructions only
13 if offered by the minority leader or his designee. The yeas
14 and nays shall be considered as ordered on the question
15 of passage of the bill and on any conference report there-
16 on. Clause 5(c) of rule XXI shall not apply to the bill,
17 amendments thereto, or conference reports thereon.

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
