Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3259) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 1997 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 3259) to authorize appropriations
3 for fiscal year 1997 for intelligence and intelligence-relat-
4 ed activities of the United States Government, the Com-
5 munity Management Account, and the Central intelligence
6 Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other
7 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
8 with. Points of order against consideration of the bill for
9 failure to comply with section 302(f), 308(a), or 401(a)
10 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. Gen-
11 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not ex-
12 ceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair-
13 man and ranking minority member of the Permanent Se-
14 lect Committee on Intelligence. After general debate the
15 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
16 minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original
17 bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute
18 rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-
19 ommended by the Permanent Select Committee On Intel-
20 ligence now printed in the bill. The committee amendment
21 in the nature of a substitute shall be considered by title
22 rather than by section. The first section and each title
23 shall be considered as read. Points of order against the
24 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute for
25 failure to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI, clause 5(b)

1 of rule XXI, or section 302(f) or 401(a) of the Congres-
2 sional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. No amendment to
3 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute
4 shall be in order unless printed in the portion of the Con-
5 gressional Record designated for that purpose in clause
6 6 of rule XXIII. The Chairman of the Committee of the
7 Whole may postpone until a time during further consider-
8 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-
9 corded vote on any amendment. The Chairman of the
10 Committee of the Whole may reduce to not less than five
11 minutes the time for voting by electronic device on any
12 postponed question that immediately follows another vote
13 by electronic device without intervening business, provided
14 that the time for voting by electronic device on the first
15 in any series of questions shall be not less than fifteen
16 minutes. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
17 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
18 to the House with such amendments as may have been
19 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the
20 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of
21 the Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in
22 the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be
23 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto
24 to final passage without intervening motion except one
25 motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
