A BILL

To amend the independent counsel statute to permit appointees of an independent counsel to receive travel reimbursements for successive 6-month periods after 1 year of service.

3 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT TO THE INDEPENDENT COUNSEL**
4 **STATUTE TO PROVIDE CERTAIN TRAVEL EX-**
5 **PENSE REIMBURSEMENTS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 594(b)(3)(A) of title 28,
7 United States Code, is amended in the second sentence
8 by—

1 (1) striking “by 6 months” and inserting “for
2 successive 6-month periods”; and

3 (2) inserting “on each occasion” after “cer-
4 tifies”.

5 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by
6 this section shall apply to independent counsels and their
7 appointees effective on or after December 31, 1995.
