A BILL

To provide for a minimum presence of INS agents in each State.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Immigration Control
5 Enforcement Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. MINIMUM STATE INS PRESENCE.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 103 (8 U.S.C. 1103) is
8 amended by adding at the end the following new
9 subsection.

10 “(e) The Attorney General shall ensure that no State
11 is allocated fewer than 10 full-time active duty agents of

1 the Immigration and Naturalization Service to carry out
2 the enforcement, examinations, and inspections functions
3 of the Service for the purposes of effective enforcement
4 of the Immigration and Nationality Act.”.

5 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This Act shall take effect 90
6 days after the date of its enactment.
