Mr. BINGAMAN (for himself and Mr. DOMENICI) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To modify the boundary of Bandelier National Monument in the State of New Mexico, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Bandelier National
5 Monument Boundary Modification Act of 1996”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.**

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

8 (1) under the provisions of a special use permit,
9 sewage lagoons for Bandelier National Monument,
10 established by Proclamation No. 1322 (16 U.S.C.

1 431 note) (referred to in this Act as the “monu-
2 ment”) are located on land administered by the Sec-
3 retary of Energy that is adjacent to the monument;
4 and

5 (2) modification of the boundary of the monu-
6 ment to include the land on which the sewage la-
7 goons are situated—

8 (A) would facilitate administration of both
9 the monument and the adjacent land that would
10 remain under the administrative jurisdiction of
11 the Secretary of Energy; and

12 (B) can be accomplished at no cost.

13 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to modify
14 the boundary between the monument and adjacent De-
15 partment of Energy land to facilitate management of the
16 monument and Department of Energy lands.

17 **SEC. 3. BOUNDARY MODIFICATION.**

18 (a) TRANSFER OF ADMINISTRATIVE JURISDIC-
19 TION.—The Secretary of Energy shall transfer to the Sec-
20 retary of the Interior administrative jurisdiction over the
21 land described in subsection (b).

22 (b) LAND DESCRIPTION.—The land described in this
23 subsection is the land comprising approximately 4.47
24 acres depicted on map 315/80,051, dated March 1995.

1 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—Effective as of the date of the
2 transfer under subsection (a), the land and interests in
3 land transferred pursuant to subsection (a) shall be—

4 (1) administered as part of the monument; and

5 (2) subject to all laws applicable to the monu-
6 ment and all laws generally applicable to units of the
7 National Park System.

8 (d) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map re-
9 ferred to in subsection (b) shall be kept on file and avail-
10 able for public inspection in the appropriate offices of the
11 National Park Service of the Department of the Interior.
