Mr. BROWN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

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## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study concerning equity regarding entrance, tourism, and recreational fees for the use of Federal lands and facilities, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. FEDERAL FACILITIES FEE EQUITY.**

4       (a) POLICY.—It is the policy of Congress that en-  
5       trance, tourism, and recreational use fees for the use of  
6       Federal lands and facilities not discriminate against any  
7       State or any region of the country.

1 (b) FEE STUDY.—Not later than May 1, 1996, the  
2 Secretary of the Interior, in cooperation with the heads  
3 of other affected agencies, shall prepare and submit to  
4 Congress a report that—

5 (1) identifies all Federal lands and facilities  
6 that provide tourism or recreational use; and

7 (2) analyzes by State and region any fees  
8 charged for entrance to or for tourism or rec-  
9 reational use of Federal lands and facilities in a  
10 State or region, individually and collectively.

11 (c) RECOMMENDATIONS.—Not later than May 1,  
12 1997, the Secretary of the Interior, in cooperation with  
13 the heads of other affected agencies, shall prepare and  
14 submit to Congress any recommendations that the Sec-  
15 retary may have for implementing the policy stated in sub-  
16 section (a).

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
