Mr. WARNER (for himself and Mr. ROBB) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to acquire and to convey certain lands or interests in lands to improve the management, protection, and administration of Colonial National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. COLONIAL NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK.**

4 (a) TRANSFER AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY.—The Sec-
5 retary of the Interior (hereinafter in this Act referred to
6 as the “Secretary”) is authorized to transfer, without re-
7 imbursement, to York County, Virginia, that portion of

1 the existing sewage disposal system, including related im-
2 provements and structures, owned by the United States
3 and located within the Colonial National Historical Park,
4 together with such rights-of-way as are determined by the
5 Secretary to be necessary to maintain and operate such
6 system.

7 (b) REPAIR AND REHABILITATION OF SYSTEM.—The
8 Secretary is authorized to enter into a cooperative agree-
9 ment with York County, Virginia, under which the Sec-
10 retary will pay a portion, not to exceed \$110,000, of the
11 costs of repair and rehabilitation of the sewage disposal
12 system referred to in subsection (a).

13 (c) FEES AND CHARGES.—In consideration for the
14 rights-of-way granted under subsection (a), and in rec-
15 ognition of the National Park Service's contribution au-
16 thorized under subsection (b), the cooperative agreement
17 under subsection (b) shall provide for a reduction in, or
18 the elimination of, the amounts charged to the National
19 Park Service for its sewage disposal. The cooperative
20 agreement shall also provide for minimizing the impact of
21 the sewage disposal system on the park and its resources.
22 Such system may not be enlarged or substantially altered
23 without National Park Service concurrence.

1 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
2 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be
3 necessary to carry out this section.
