Mr. PRYOR introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred jointly pursuant to the order of August 4, 1977, to the Committees on the Budget and Governmental Affairs, with instructions that if one committee reports, the other committee have thirty days to report or be discharged

A BILL

To reduce spending in fiscal year 1996, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Spending Reductions
5 Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. SERVICE CONTRACTS.**

7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, not more
8 than \$100,000,000,000 shall be available for service con-
9 tracts in fiscal year 1996.

1 **SEC. 3. FEDERALLY FUNDED RESEARCH AND DEVELOP-**
2 **MENT CENTERS.**

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, not more
4 than \$1,000,000,000 shall be available for federally fund-
5 ed research and development centers at the Department
6 of Defense in fiscal year 1996.

7 **SEC. 4. FOREIGN MILITARY FINANCING.**

8 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, not more
9 than \$3,000,000,000 shall be available for the foreign
10 military financing program in fiscal year 1996.

11 **SEC. 5. WORLD BANK FUNDING.**

12 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in fiscal
13 year 1996—

14 (1) not more than \$1,000,000,000 shall be
15 available for the International Development Associa-
16 tion; and

17 (2) not more than \$58,000,000 shall be avail-
18 able for the International Finance Corporation.

19 **SEC. 6. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE HUMANITARIAN AND**
20 **CIVIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS.**

21 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, not more
22 than \$25,000,000 shall be available for humanitarian as-
23 sistance in fiscal year 1996.
