A BILL

To provide an exemption from certain hazardous material transportation regulations for small cargo tank vehicles with a capacity of not more than 3,500 gallons that transport petroleum, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Hazardous Materials
5 Regulatory Relief Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. SMALL CARGO TANK VEHICLE EXEMPTION.**

7 The Secretary of Transportation shall exclude from
8 the application of any regulation promulgated by the Sec-

1 retary of Transportation pursuant to chapter 51 of title
2 49, United States Code, pertaining to the maintenance,
3 reconditioning, repair, inspection, or testing of packages,
4 or any other function having an effect on the continuing
5 qualification and use of packaging, any cargo tank vehicle
6 that—

7 (1) has a capacity of not more than 3,500 gal-
8 lons; and

9 (2) is used to transport petroleum products in
10 intrastate or interstate transportation within a 100
11 air-mile radius of the principal place of business of
12 the owner or lessee of the cargo tank vehicle.
