Mr. DOLE (for himself and Mr. DASCHLE) submitted the following resolution;  
which was considered and agreed to

## RESOLUTION

To authorize the production of records by the Select  
Committee on Intelligence.

Whereas the Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Justice has requested that the Select Committee on Intelligence provide it with copies of committee records relevant to the Office's pending review of matters related to the Aldrich Ames case;

Whereas, by the privileges of the Senate of the United States and rule XI of the Standing Rules of the Senate, no evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate can, by administrative or judicial process, be taken from such control or possession but by permission of the Senate;

Whereas, when it appears that documents, papers, and records under the control or in the possession of the Sen-

ate may promote the administration of justice, the Senate will take such action as will promote the ends of justice consistently with the privileges of the Senate: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved*, That the Chairman and Vice Chairman of  
2 the Select Committee on Intelligence, acting jointly, are  
3 authorized to provide to the Office of Inspector General  
4 of the Department of Justice, under appropriate security  
5 procedures, copies of records that the Office has requested  
6 for use in connection with its pending review into matters  
7 related to the Aldrich Ames case.
