Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Small Business.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

JANUARY 12 (legislative day, JANUARY 10), 1995

Mr. BOND, from the Committee on Small Business, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Small
Business.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Committee on Small Business is authorized from
8 March 1, 1995, through February 29, 1996, and March
9 1, 1996, through February 28, 1997, in its discretion—
10 (1) to make expenditures from the contingent
11 fund of the Senate,

1 (2) to employ personnel, and

2 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
3 department or agency concerned and the Committee
4 on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-
5 able or non-reimbursable basis the services of per-
6 sonnel of any such department or agency.

7 SEC. 2(a) The expenses of the committee for the pe-
8 riod March 1, 1995, through February 29, 1996, under
9 this resolution shall not exceed \$1,000,980, of which
10 amount—

11 (1) not to exceed \$10,000 may be expended for
12 the procurement of the services of individual consult-
13 ants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by sec-
14 tion 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
15 1946, as amended), and

16 (2) not to exceed \$5,000 may be expended for
17 the training of the professional staff of such commit-
18 tee (under procedures specified by section 202(j) of
19 the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946).

20 (b) For the period March 1, 1996, through February
21 28, 1997, expenses of the committee under this resolution
22 shall not exceed \$1,023,582, of which—

23 (1) not to exceed \$10,000 may be expended for
24 the procurement of the services of individual consult-
25 ants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by sec-

1 tion 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
2 1946, as amended), and

3 (2) not to exceed \$5,000 may be expended for
4 the training of the professional staff of such commit-
5 tee (under procedures specified by section 202(j) of
6 the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946).

7 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
8 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
9 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
10 date, but not later than February 29, 1996, and February
11 28, 1997, respectively.

12 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
13 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
14 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
15 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required—

16 (1) for the disbursement of salaries of employ-
17 ees paid at an annual rate,

18 (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
19 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and
20 Doorkeeper, United States Senate,

21 (3) for the payment of stationery supplies pur-
22 chased through the Keeper of the Stationery, United
23 States Senate,

24 (4) for payments to the Postmaster, United
25 States Senate,

1 (5) for the payment of metered charges on
2 copying equipment provided by the Office of the Ser-
3 geant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Sen-
4 ate, or (6) for the payment of Senate Recording and
5 Photographic Services.

6 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
7 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
8 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
9 1995, through February 29, 1996, Appropriations account
10 for “Expenses of Inquiries and Investigations”.

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
