## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol grounds for the Greater  
Washington Soap Box Derby.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2        *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF SOAP BOX DERBY RACES**  
2 **ON CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

3 The Greater Washington Soap Box Derby Associa-  
4 tion (hereinafter in this resolution referred to as the “As-  
5 sociation”) shall be permitted to sponsor a public event,  
6 soap box derby races, on the Capitol grounds on July 11,  
7 1998, or on such other date as the Speaker of the House  
8 of Representatives and the President pro tempore of the  
9 Senate may jointly designate.

10 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS.**

11 The event to be carried out under this resolution shall  
12 be free of admission charge to the public and arranged  
13 not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under condi-  
14 tions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and  
15 the Capitol Police Board, except that the Association shall  
16 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities  
17 incident to all activities associated with the event.

18 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

19 For the purposes of this resolution, the Association  
20 is authorized to erect upon the Capitol grounds, subject  
21 to the approval of the Architect of the Capitol, such stage,  
22 sound amplification devices, and other related structures  
23 and equipment as may be required for the event to be ear-  
24 ried out under this resolution.

1 **SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**

2       The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police  
3 Board are authorized to make any such additional ar-  
4 rangements that may be required to carry out the event  
5 ~~under this resolution.~~

6 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF SOAP BOX DERBY RACES**  
7                                   **ON CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

8       *The Greater Washington Soap Box Derby Association*  
9 *(hereinafter in this resolution referred to as the "Associa-*  
10 *tion") shall be permitted to sponsor a public event, soap*  
11 *box derby races, on the Capitol grounds on July 11, 1998,*  
12 *or on such other date as the Speaker of the House of Rep-*  
13 *resentatives and the Committee on Rules and Administra-*  
14 *tion of the Senate may jointly designate.*

15 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS.**

16       *The event to be carried out under this resolution shall*  
17 *be free of admission charge to the public and arranged not*  
18 *to interfere with the needs of Congress, under conditions to*  
19 *be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol*  
20 *Police Board; except that the Association shall assume full*  
21 *responsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident to all*  
22 *activities associated with the event.*

23 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

24       *For the purposes of this resolution, the Association is*  
25 *authorized to erect upon the Capitol grounds, subject to the*  
26 *approval of the Architect of the Capitol, such stage, sound*

1 *amplification devices, and other related structures and*  
2 *equipment as may be required for the event to be carried*  
3 *out under this resolution.*

4 **SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**

5 *The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police*  
6 *Board are authorized to make any such additional arrange-*  
7 *ments that may be required to carry out the event under*  
8 *this resolution.*

9 **SEC. 5. APPLICABILITY OF PROHIBITIONS.**

10 *Nothing in this resolution may be construed to waive*  
11 *the applicability of the prohibitions established by section*  
12 *4 of the Act of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat.*  
13 *718), concerning sales, displays, and solicitations on the*  
14 *Capitol Grounds.*
