1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF RUNNING OF D.C. SPECIAL**
 2 **OLYMPICS LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN**
 3 **THROUGH CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

4 On May 29, 1998, or on such other date as the
 5 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Commit-
 6 tee on Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly
 7 designate, the 1998 District of Columbia Special Olympics
 8 Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this resolution referred
 9 to as the "event") may be run through the Capitol
 10 Grounds, as part of the journey of the Special Olympics
 11 torch to the District of Columbia Special Olympics sum-
 12 mer games at Gallaudet University in the District of Co-
 13 lumbia.

14 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

15 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
 16 may be necessary to carry out the event.

17 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
 18 **TIONS.**

19 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
 20 for physical preparations for the event.

21 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF RUNNING OF D.C. SPECIAL**
 22 **OLYMPICS LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN**
 23 **THROUGH CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

24 *On May 29, 1998, or on such other date as the Speaker*
 25 *of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Rules*
 26 *and Administration of the Senate may jointly designate,*

1 *the 1998 District of Columbia Special Olympics Law En-*
2 *forcement Torch Run (in this resolution referred to as the*
3 *“event”)* may be run through the Capitol Grounds, as part
4 *of the journey of the Special Olympics torch to the District*
5 *of Columbia Special Olympics summer games at Gallaudet*
6 *University in the District of Columbia.*

7 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

8 *The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as*
9 *may be necessary to carry out the event.*

10 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
11 **TIONS.**

12 *The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions*
13 *for physical preparations for the event.*

14 **SEC. 4. APPLICABILITY OF PROHIBITIONS.**

15 *Nothing in this resolution may be construed to waive*
16 *the applicability of the prohibitions established by section*
17 *4 of the Act of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat.*
18 *718), concerning sales, displays, and solicitations on the*
19 *Capitol Grounds.*

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
