Mr. KIM submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to
the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the seven-
teenth annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**
4 **PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL SERVICE.**

5 The National Fraternal Order of Police and its auxil-
6 iary shall be permitted to sponsor a public event, the sev-
7 enteenth annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Serv-
8 ice, on the Capitol Grounds on May 15, 1998, or on such
9 other date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives
10 and the Committee on Rules and Administration of the

1 Senate may jointly designate, in order to honor the more
2 than 160 law enforcement officers who died in the line
3 of duty during 1997.

4 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized to be con-
6 ducted on the Capitol Grounds under section 1 shall be
7 free of admission charge to the public and arranged not
8 to interfere with the needs of Congress, under conditions
9 to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the
10 Capitol Police Board.

11 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The National
12 Fraternal Order of Police and its auxiliary shall assume
13 full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident
14 to all activities associated with the event.

15 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

16 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
17 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the National Fra-
18 ternal Order of Police and its auxiliary are authorized to
19 erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplifi-
20 cation devices, and other related structures and equip-
21 ment, as may be required for the event authorized to be
22 conducted on the Capitol Grounds under section 1.

23 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
24 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized

- 1 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
- 2 quired to carry out the event.
