CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To redesignate the United States Capitol Police headquarters building located at 119 D Street, Northeast, Washington, D.C., as the “Eney, Chestnut, Gibson Memorial Building”.

Whereas the United States Capitol Police force has protected the Capitol and upheld the beacon of democracy in America;

Whereas 3 officers of the United States Capitol Police force have lost their lives in the line of duty;

Whereas Sgt. Christopher Eney was killed on August 24, 1984, during a training exercise;

Whereas officer Jacob “J.J.” Chestnut was killed on July 24, 1998, while guarding his post at the Capitol; and

Whereas Detective John Gibson was killed on July 24, 1998,
while protecting the lives of visitors, staff, and the Office
of the Majority Whip: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That the United States Capitol Police head-
3 quarters building located at 119 D Street, Northeast,
4 Washington, D.C., shall be known and designated as the
5 “Eney, Chestnut, Gibson Memorial Building”.
