Mr. FRELINGHUYSEN submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that official mail sent by Government agencies at taxpayer expense should be subject to certain uniform standards.

Whereas franked mail sent from within the legislative branch of the Government is subject to strict regulations relating to their content as well as the tracking of expenses associated therewith; and

Whereas the executive branch of the Government, by contrast, is not similarly subject to uniform regulations on the content of taxpayer-financed penalty mail: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that
3 agencies within the executive branch of the Government

- 1 should be required annually to purge their mailing lists
- 2 to ensure that taxpayer dollars are used efficiently, and
- 3 to report on the accuracy of such lists.
