CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That when the House adjourns on the legisla-
3 tive day of Wednesday, October 21, 1998, or Thursday,
4 October 22, 1998, on a motion offered pursuant to this
5 concurrent resolution by its Majority Leader or his des-

1 ignee, it stand adjourned sine die, or until noon on the
2 second day after Members are notified to reassemble pur-
3 suant to section 2 of this concurrent resolution, or until
4 a time designated pursuant to section 3 of this resolution;
5 and that when the Senate adjourns on Wednesday, Octo-
6 ber 21, 1998, or Thursday, October 22, 1998, on a motion
7 offered pursuant to this concurrent resolution by its Ma-
8 jority Leader or his designee, it stand adjourned sine die,
9 or until noon on the second day after Members are notified
10 to reassemble pursuant to section 2 of this concurrent res-
11 olution.

12 SEC. 2. The Speaker of the House and the Majority
13 Leader of the Senate, acting jointly after consultation with
14 the Minority Leader of the House and the Minority Lead-
15 er of the Senate, shall notify the Members of the House
16 and the Senate, respectively, to reassemble whenever, in
17 their opinion, the public interest shall warrant it.

18 SEC. 3. During any adjournment of the House pursu-
19 ant to this concurrent resolution, the Speaker, acting after
20 consultation with the Minority Leader, may notify the
21 Members of the House to reassemble whenever, in his
22 opinion, the public interest shall warrant it. After re-
23 assembling pursuant to this section, when the House ad-
24 journs on any day on a motion offered pursuant to this
25 section by its Majority Leader or his designee, the House

1 shall again stand adjourned pursuant to the first section
2 of this concurrent resolution.
