JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to allow the limitation of contributions and expenditures respecting elections.

Whereas the Congress seeks to ensure that all citizens, regardless of wealth, have an equal voice in elections and an equal opportunity to run for public office;

Whereas the Congress seeks to further the principle of “one person, one vote” and to preserve the integrity of the democratic system;

Whereas the Congress seeks to limit corruption with respect to elections and the appearance of such corruption; and

Whereas the Congress believes that the unlimited use of money to influence elections is incompatible with the principles of free speech and equal protection established
