Mr. McINNIS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To adjust the boundary of the White River National Forest in the State of Colorado to include all National Forest System lands within Summit County, Colorado, which are currently part of the Dillon Ranger District of the Arapaho National Forest.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. INCLUSION OF DILLON RANGER DISTRICT IN**
4 **WHITE RIVER NATIONAL FOREST, COLO-**
5 **RADO.**

6 (a) BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENTS.—

1 (1) WHITE RIVER NATIONAL FOREST.—The
2 boundary of the White River National Forest in the
3 State of Colorado is hereby adjusted to include all
4 National Forest System lands located in Summit
5 County, Colorado, such lands forming the Dillon
6 Ranger District of the Arapaho National Forest.
7 The Dillon Ranger District is hereby made a part of
8 the White River National Forest.

9 (2) ARAPAHO NATIONAL FOREST.—The bound-
10 ary of the Arapaho National Forest is hereby ad-
11 justed to exclude the National Forest System lands
12 included in the White River National Forest under
13 paragraph (1).

14 (b) REFERENCE.—Any reference to the Dillon Rang-
15 er District, Arapaho National Forest, in any existing stat-
16 ute, regulation, manual, handbook, or otherwise shall be
17 deemed to be a reference to the Dillon District, White
18 River National Forest.

19 (c) EXISTING RIGHTS.—Nothing in this section shall
20 be construed to affect valid existing rights of persons hold-
21 ing any authorization, permit, option, or other form of
22 contract existing on the date of the enactment of this Act.

23 (d) FOREST RECEIPTS.—Notwithstanding the dis-
24 tribution requirements of payments under the Act of May
25 23, 1908 (35 Stat. 260; 16 U.S.C. 500), the distribution

1 of receipts from the Arapaho National Forest and the
2 White River National Forest to affected county govern-
3 ments shall be based upon the National Forest boundaries
4 that existed on the day before the date of the enactment
5 of this Act.
