Mr. LATOURETTE introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To provide for the revision of the requirements for a Canadian border boat landing permit pursuant to section 235 of the Immigration and Nationality Act, and to require the Attorney General to report to the Congress on the impact of such revision.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CHANGE IN CANADIAN BORDER BOAT LANDING**

4 **PERMIT REQUIREMENTS.**

5 (a) REVISED REGULATIONS.—Not later than 60 days
6 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Attorney
7 General, in consultation with the Commissioner of Immi-

1 gration and Naturalization, shall issue revised regulations
2 for the implementation of section 235 of the Immigration
3 and Nationality Act with respect to the requirement that
4 certain individuals entering the United States from Can-
5 ada by boat obtain a landing permit. The revised regula-
6 tions shall provide that, in the case of a United States
7 citizen traveling in a boat of not more than 65 feet in
8 length (including a boat used for commercial purposes) on
9 a trip between the United States and Canada of not more
10 than 72 hours duration, the citizen need not obtain such
11 a permit if—

12 (1) the citizen carries a United States passport
13 for the duration of the trip; and

14 (2) the citizen is not an owner, or an operator,
15 of the boat.

16 (b) SUNSET.—The revised regulations issued under
17 subsection (a) shall cease to be effective on December 31,
18 1998. After such date, the regulations that were in effect
19 on the day before the enactment of this Act with respect
20 to the requirement that certain individuals entering the
21 United States from Canada by boat obtain a landing per-
22 mit shall resume to be effective, in the same manner and
23 to the same extent as if this Act had not been enacted.

24 (c) REPORT.—Not later than March 1, 1999, the At-
25 torney General shall report to the Congress on the impact

1 of the revised regulations issued under subsection (a) on
2 the number and nature of unauthorized entrances by indi-
3 viduals into the United States.

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
