A BILL

For the relief of Harold David Strother, Jr.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. COMPENSATION FOR VACCINE-RELATED IN-**
4 **JURY.**

5 (a) CAUSE OF INJURY.—In consideration of the find-
6 ings of the special master in the case entitled Mary Ellen
7 Strother and Harold David Strother, natural guardians of
8 Harold David Strother, Jr., a minor child, v. Secretary
9 of the Department of Health and Human Services, No.
10 88–32 V (United States Claims Court) that the injury de-
11 scribed in such findings suffered by Harold David
12 Strother, Jr. was caused by the measles, mumps, and

1 rubella (MMR) vaccine he received on August 9, 1984,
2 such injury is deemed to have been caused by such vaccine
3 for the purposes of subtitle 2 of title XXI of the Public
4 Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300aa–10 et seq.).

5 (b) PAYMENT.—The Secretary of Health and Human
6 Services shall pay compensation to Harold David Strother,
7 Jr. for the injury referred to in subsection (a) in accord-
8 ance with section 2115 of the Public Health Service Act
9 (42 U.S.C. 300aa–15).
