**AN ACT**

To designate the Federal building located at 601 Fourth Street, NW., in the District of Columbia, as the “Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington Field Office Memorial Building”, in honor of William H. Christian, Jr., Martha Dixon Martinez, Michael J. Miller, Anthony Palmisano, and Edwin R. Woodriffe.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PURPOSE.**

4 The purpose of this Act is to designate the Federal  
5 building referred to in section 2 in honor of William H.  
6 Christian, Jr., Martha Dixon Martinez, Michael J. Miller,

1 Anthony Palmisano, and Edwin R. Woodruffe, who were  
2 slain in the line of duty.

3 **SEC. 2. FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION, WASHING-**  
4 **TON FIELD OFFICE MEMORIAL BUILDING.**

5 (a) DESIGNATION.—The Federal building located at  
6 601 Fourth Street, NW., in the District of Columbia, shall  
7 be known and designated as the “Federal Bureau of In-  
8 vestigation, Washington Field Office Memorial Building”.

9 (b) REFERENCES.—Any reference in a law, map, reg-  
10 ulation, document, paper, or other record of the United  
11 States to the Federal building referred to in subsection  
12 (a) shall be deemed to be a reference to the “Federal Bu-  
13 reau of Investigation, Washington Field Office Memorial  
14 Building”.
