## A BILL

To direct the Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to conduct a study of the feasibility of establishing a national recreational fishing license.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATIONAL RECREATIONAL FISHING LICENSE**

4 **STUDY.**

5 (a) STUDY.—

6 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the United  
7 States Fish and Wildlife Service shall conduct a  
8 study of the feasibility and desirability of establish-

1 ing, under Federal law, a national recreational fish-  
2 ing license that—

3 (A) would be available to individuals age  
4 50 years old or older; and

5 (B) would grant to a holder of such a li-  
6 cense the right to engage in recreational fishing  
7 in navigable waters in any State, under the  
8 same conditions and restrictions that apply  
9 under the laws of the State to an individual  
10 who holds a license, permit, or other authoriza-  
11 tion for that fishing issued by the State.

12 (2) FEES.—The study shall include develop-  
13 ment of formulas for—

14 (A) imposition of fees for such a national  
15 recreational fishing license; and

16 (B) allocation among the States of  
17 amounts received as such fees that would com-  
18 pletely offset all decreases in State revenues re-  
19 sulting from any reduction in sales of State rec-  
20 reational fishing licenses because of the issu-  
21 ance of such national recreational fishing li-  
22 censes.

23 (b) REPORT.—The Director shall submit a report to  
24 the Congress on the study conducted under this section,

1 by not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment  
2 of this Act.
