## A BILL

To repeal a provision of the Indian Self-Determination Act which exempts certain former officers and employees of the United States from restrictions related to aiding and advising Indian tribes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF EXEMPTION.**

4       Section 104(j) of the Indian Self-Determination Act  
5       (25 U.S.C. 450i(j)) is amended—

6               (1) by striking “sections” and inserting “sec-  
7       tion”; and

1           (2) by striking “and 207”.

2   **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICABILITY.**

3           (a) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by  
4 section 1 shall take effect 30 days after the date of the  
5 enactment of this Act.

6           (b) **APPLICABILITY.**—The amendments made by sec-  
7 tion 1 shall not apply to former officers and employees  
8 who received an exemption to section 207 of title 18,  
9 United States Code, pursuant to section 104(j) of the In-  
10 dian Self-Determination Act before the effective date of  
11 such amendments.
