## A BILL

To award a congressional gold medal to Gerald R. and Betty Ford.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.**

2 (a) PRESENTATION AUTHORIZED.—The President is  
3 authorized to present, on behalf of the Congress, to Gerald  
4 R. and Betty Ford a gold medal of appropriate design—

5 (1) in recognition of their dedicated public serv-  
6 ice and outstanding humanitarian contributions to  
7 the people of the United States; and

8 (2) in commemoration of the following occa-  
9 sions in 1998:

10 (A) The 85th anniversary of the birth of  
11 President Ford.

12 (B) The 80th anniversary of the birth of  
13 Mrs. Ford.

14 (C) The 50th wedding anniversary of  
15 President and Mrs. Ford.

16 (D) The 50th anniversary of the 1st elec-  
17 tion of Gerald R. Ford to the United States  
18 House of Representatives.

19 (E) The 25th anniversary of the approval  
20 of Gerald R. Ford by the Congress to become  
21 Vice President of the United States.

22 (b) DESIGN AND STRIKING.—For purposes of the  
23 presentation referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary  
24 of the Treasury shall strike a gold medal with suitable em-  
25 blems, devices, and inscriptions to be determined by the  
26 Secretary.

1           (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATION.—There are  
2 authorized to be appropriated not to exceed \$20,000 to  
3 carry out this section.

4 **SEC. 2. DUPLICATE MEDALS.**

5           (a) STRIKING AND SALE.—The Secretary of the  
6 Treasury may strike and sell duplicates in bronze of the  
7 gold medal struck pursuant to section 1 under such regu-  
8 lations as the Secretary may prescribe, at a price sufficient  
9 to cover the cost thereof, including labor, materials, dies,  
10 use of machinery, and overhead expenses, and the cost of  
11 the gold medal.

12           (b) REIMBURSEMENT OF APPROPRIATION.—The ap-  
13 propriation used to carry out section 1 shall be reimbursed  
14 out of the proceeds of sales under subsection (a).

15 **SEC. 3. NATIONAL MEDALS.**

16           The medals struck pursuant to this Act are national  
17 medals for purposes of chapter 51 of title 31, United  
18 States Code.
