Mr. YOUNG of Alaska introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To restore the second amendment rights of all Americans.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Second Amendment
5 Restoration and Protection Act of 1998”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF PUBLIC LAW 103-159.**

7 (a) REPEAL.—Public Law 103-159 and each amend-
8 ment made by such Act is repealed, and title 18, United
9 States Code, and section 509 of title I of the Omnibus
10 Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, shall be ap-
11 plied and administered as if Public Law 103-159 had
12 never been enacted.

1 (b) INTERPRETIVE RULE.—Any liability, penalty, or
2 forfeiture incurred under Public Law 103–159 or under
3 any amendment made by such Act is hereby extinguished,
4 and any action or prosecution for the enforcement of any
5 such liability, penalty, or forfeiture shall not be sustained.

6 **SEC. 3. REPEAL OF ASSAULT WEAPONS BAN.**

7 (a) REPEAL.—Subtitle A of title XI of the Violent
8 Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 and
9 each amendment made by such subtitle is repealed, and
10 title 18, United States Code, shall be applied and adminis-
11 tered as if such subtitle had never been enacted.

12 (b) INTERPRETIVE RULE.—Any liability, penalty, or
13 forfeiture incurred under subtitle A of title XI of the Vio-
14 lent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 or
15 under any amendment made by such subtitle is hereby ex-
16 tinguished, and any action or prosecution for the enforce-
17 ment of any such liability, penalty, or forfeiture shall not
18 be sustained.
